

Triangle "Park" is the Pits



Apromised open-space park at the corner of 45th Street and Guadalupe was a major concession made by urban developer Tom Terkel of Cencor Reality in order to get neighbor buy-in for the Triangle project. The "New Urbanist" landscape neighbors agreed to included a park with wetland ponds similar to the Central Market, and a bike/pedestrian path, which connected the neighborhood with the Triangle Commons and businesses.

The Triangle development went up apartment-by-apartment, but the park failed to appear. Neighbors assumed that the drainage pit, which now occupies the majority of this corner, was a temporary measure needed to get the project underway, and that soon our pond, trees, grass, flowers and trail would materialize. But we've now been told that the developers' plan for the corner consists of lit-

tle more than the drainage ditch. What happened to Tom Terkel's promised park?

Our "park" is a drainage pit, surrounded by a chain-link fence. To outraged neighbors, the pit is more than a broken promise, more than an eyesore; it's become a neighborhood problem: a trash pit, a hangout, a homeless shelter, and a frequent target for graffiti. The

floodlines is a public art/ theater performance conceived, created and directed by Austin artist Jaclyn Pryor, a student at UT in the Performance as Public Practice PhD program. (For those of you who experienced First Night Austin, Jaclyn conceived of and produced Bread in 2005 and Pink in 2006.)

The idea for the project came from the sense of loss Jaclyn felt after September 11th and expanded into a theme of loss and memory.

It's based on various experiences of her life such as dreams, memories of her Jewish grandmother, and of course, imagination. Participants become part of a funereal procession exploring loss, memories and a sense of nostalgia as the performance winds its way through the streets of NUNA and Hyde Park -- neighborhoods chosen for their historical context. The first performance of floodlines was held in the Spring of 2004. This year's performance, set for Sunday, April 22nd at 2 pm, will mark the fourth in a seven year cycle.

Ann Graham, former Co-President of Hyde Park Neighborhood Association and Co-Founder of First Night Austin, describes floodlines as one of the most affecting pieces of theater she has ever experienced. Ann was so moved by experiencing last year's performance that this year she is joining with Jaclyn to produce the event and extend its impact further throughout the neighborhood. In an effort to spread the word, engage the broader community (and raise some necessary funds to match a City of Austin Cultural Contracts grant), Ann will also oversee a neighborhood social event set for earlier in April. Because only 40 seats can actually sold for the event, Jaclyn is creating a set of vignettes in which neighbors will be invited to participate directly - playing a literal role in the production. February 2007 General Meeting Minutes

President Elaine Meenehan called the February 5 Hyde Park Neighborhood Association general meeting to order at 7 p.m.

The first item on the agenda was discussion regarding the property at **4513 Avenue B.** Development Review Committee Chairman Stan Kozinsky explained that there is a home and two rental units on this property. The City of Austin is in the process of bringing enforcement action on this property because the three living units are considered to be triplex use, and this violates the zoning in Hyde Park. The owner of the property requested that HPNA help him retain the triplex use. He explained that he had purchased the property with the understanding that it was legal to have three living units on the property. Others pointed out that an illegal use is just that, and there is no variance or other action the City can take to allow the use

After a lengthy discussion, members voted on a motion to refer the matter back to the Development Review Committee. This motion failed. After additional discussion, a motion was made to give verbal support in this instance for this neighbor to retain illegal triplex use of the property. This motion failed on a vote of 29 in favor and 30 against.

Next, Elaine Meenehan discussed the plans to create a **Local Historic District** in Hyde Park. Sharon Majors, Chair of the Local Historic District Committee, was unable to attend. Elaine asked for a show of hands in support of working toward this goal. The response was overwhelming in support. The committee will continue working on the plans and bring them back to the general members at a later date.

Last, but certainly not least, was the discussion and vote on the request by Thad Avery and **Vino Vino** for HPNA to support the application for a Conditional Use Permit for off-site parking to allow a restaurant at the Vino Vino building on Guadalupe. The Conditional Use Permit would allow Vino Vino to satisfy the parking requirements by using the parking lot at Midas Muffler Shop on Guadalupe. Midas Muffler closes at 6:00 PM, and the Vino Vino restaurant would open at 6:00 PM. Zoning allows off-site parking, but the HPNA NCCD requires a request of this type to go before the Planning Commission.

Stan Kozinsky reported that the Development Review Committee had voted 5 to 1 to support the request with certain conditions. This recommendation was forwarded to the Steering Committee. Elaine Meenehan reported that the Steering Committee voted that it didn't have enough information to make a recommendation to the HPNA General Members and asked the interested parties to work toward a solution for the parking issues in this section of Guadalupe. Therefore, the Steering Committee voted to ask the interested parties to return in 30 days.

A lengthy debate moderated by Elaine Meenehan and Nick van Bavel, serving as Parliamentarian, ensued. Many expressed unqualified support for Vino Vino's request. Others stated concern about parking adversely affecting the neighbors on Avenue A and other businesses on Guadalupe.

Local Historic District Update

PNA has hired Terri Myers of Preservation Central to do the survey part of the application for a local historic district. 51% of the houses in the designated area will need to be contributing structures. Terri and her assistants feel that most of Hyde Park will qualify for that. Terri is in the process of finalizing the application for the Harthan Street district which will be Austin's first local historic district. This and her familiarity with Hyde Park will give her a head start in working on this.

Another requirement is that 60% of the property owners need to sign on. This may be a challenge, especially in areas that have many absentee owners. We will need the help of neighbors.

Because historic districts are new to Austin, there is still much we do not know. I am hopeful that we will have some input into crafting requirements for our district. Hyde Park is not only one of our city's most historic areas but a leader among Austin's neighborhoods.

After a long general meeting, a motion to adjourn was made, seconded, and the President called the meeting to an end.



Crime Report

There are several updates that I wanted to pass on to you from "our" Officer Vargas. He says that auto thefts are on the rise. A theft ring is targeting Honda Civics and Acura Integras. Several stolen autos were recovered in San Antonio in a Chop-Shop. He reported that APD is working closely with the San Antonio P.D. to shut them down.

The annual Warrant Round-Up begins on March 3rd. If someone has an outstanding warrant, Class C or above, it is possible that APD will be knocking on their door at home or at work. It will continue through the end of that week.

Operation Homestead has yielded quite a few arrests which in turn reduced the number of residential burglaries. It has also had an effect on vehicle burglaries, but Officer Vargas reported that vehicle burglary in the Hyde Park Gym area continues to be a problem, especially in the early morning hours. He recommended removing valuable items from the auto or putting them out of sight.

Several neighbors have reported missing items from their yards and porches, so continue to be vigilant and, if possible, bring things inside your home or garage. Remember to report any crime by calling 311, if the crime has already happened or 911, if the crime is in progress.



As a friendly reminder, be courteous to your neighbors by parking your vehicles in front of your own home and not your neighbor's. I have heard from neighbors who say that cars are parked in front of their homes for days at a time. Unfortunately, there is no law against parking a vehicle on a public street, but it boils down to respecting your neighbor's space.

Oak Leaf Roller

Many people are asking already if oak leaf rollers will grace us with their presence again this year. While I'm hoping that the ice storm we had in January wiped out some of the eggs, I'm sure that there will be a few lingering caterpillars. Only time will tell if there will be a large population again this year.

Oak leaf rollers are yellowish-green caterpillars with a dark brown head capsule that dangle from silken thread on oak trees. These caterpillars usually show up when the

spring.

Some nurseries recommend releasing Trichogramma wasps.

oak trees leaf out in the

If you choose to release Trichogramma, remember that they parasitize only the egg stage, so they should be released before you see caterpillars. Horticultural oils may also be used on the egg stage. If you have mature oaks that are tall, it is best to hire a professional with the proper equipment to reach all parts of the

Once caterpillars emerge, Bacillus thuringiensis variety kurstaki may be used. Bt targets only caterpillars, though it does not differentiate between pest caterpillars and those that people enjoy having, such as ones that become butterflies. When using Bt, good coverage is key because the caterpillars need to consume a lethal amount of the toxin. Other possible control methods would be active ingredients such as spinosad (spinosyns) or carbaryl.





bike/pedestrian path includes flights of steep stairs making it impassable to bikes, strollers, and wheel-chairs. The path is unattractive, poorly lit, hidden from view and unsafe — judging by the flood debris high up on the stairs.

As a result of neighbors' negative reactions, the developers and the General Land Office (GLO) have displayed some willingness to work with the neighborhood to develop a more acceptable plan, though we don't yet know to what extent they are willing to address our concerns. As a first step, we will meet on the site with representatives of the developer and GLO (2/22).

If, after this meeting, the developers seem willing to work with us to develop a more appropriate plan for the site, we will need people who are willing to work on, and follow, the process.

If, after the meeting, it appears that the developers are unwilling to create a park that comes closer to what was promised to us, then we will need to mount a protest effort.
