
October Meeting Minutes

Dresident John Kerr called the Γ October $^{\prime}$ 05 HPNA meeting to order at 7:10 PM. The first order of business was election of HPNA officers for 2005-06. The Nominating Committee proposed the following officers: John Kerr, President; Denise Girard and Elaine Meenahan, Co-Vice Presidents; Sam Waring, Secretary; and Carmin Way, Treasurer. There were no nominations from the floor, so the President called for election by acclamation. The motion passed. The President thanked Glen Coleman and Alan Marburger for serving as the Nominating Committee.

John Kerr reminded everyone that the thirty-first annual **Fire Station Festival** would be held on Sunday, October 16th in celebration of the structure whose then-imminent closing first sparked formation of HPNA, and of the firefighters who work there and share our neighborhood today.

Density

Bruce Babbitt, the two-term governor of Arizona and two-term Secretary of the Interior in the Clinton administration, was in town a few weeks back to promote his new book, Cities in the Wilderness: A New Vision of Land Use in America. At a lecture at UT, he focused mainly on regional planning. But when asked about urban issues he said, "The primary issue facing cities is how to make density work."

So Hyde Park is caught up in the same issue that is being played out not only across the United States but around the world: how to pack more people and businesses into existing urban areas while maintaining or even enhancing the quality of life.

One solution is the high-rise. This is well underway downtown and west of the university. Another solution is to create more public

spaces in areas of increasing density, such as Hyde Park. This is not easy, given a fixed amount of land, but it is precisely what we're trying to do with the proposed paseo project at 44th & Ave. D: substitute a park for a block of street.

Earlier this year, the Supreme Court decision in Kelo vs. City of New London gave city governments enormous powers of condemnation. As Justice Sandra Day O'Connor noted in her dissent, "Any property may now be taken for the benefit of another private property, but the fallout from this decision will not be random. The beneficiaries are likely to be those citizens with disproportionate influence and power in the political process, including large corporations and development firms." In a separate dissent, Justice Clarence Thomas noted the decision would likely result in new urban renewal projects that have historically displaced minorities, the elderly and the poor. Washington, D.C. mayor Anthony Williams -- who praised the Court's decision - is expected to evict small businesses and homeowners later this year to build a new, privately-held baseball stadium.

Do not think it could not happen here. In a city perennially strapped for cash, it is easy to imagine a developer driving a city council member through stretches of the avenues between 45th and North Loop and asking the politician if he would like to quadruple the density and increase the tax



base tenfold, strengthen the case for light rail, throw in a little affordable housing for lagniappe and make the whole thing look like downtown Santa Barbara. From a politician's viewpoint, what's not to love?

Hyde Park's reaction to the city's push for densification has usually been along the lines of "Thanks, but we'd rather not." The reason for this reluctance is that investors with deep pockets were moving in, tearing down bungalows and replacing them with ugly "super duplexes" and worse.

But time is not on our side. If we don't find our own path to greater density, the developers will find a way for us. The case of the wine bar suggests some measures that could help. One would be a "conditional use" clause in

our zoning ordinances, which would, for example, allow increasing the zoning classification for a particular use but which would revert to its previous, lower zoning after the tenant left.

Another tool would be creating finer gradations in the existing zoning classifications. Thus a wine bar or a tapas bar would be zoned differently than a "real" bar, and all would be zoned differently than a liquor store. This is still a democracy; why shouldn't we be able to do this? Because of inertia in the city bureaucracy?

In the meantime, I think we need to be creative in seeking parking solutions, and flexible and realistic in accommodating development. I assure you some creative thinking is going into the parking issue related to the wine bar and may bear fruit by the November general meeting.

We also need to be willing to take a chance. Developments like the wine bar gives us a chance to experiment on the smallest possible scale: the unit of one. Yes, if the wine bar doesn't succeed, it could be replaced by a real bar. Could it be the kind of bar that attracts Hell's Angels, piercing our tranquil Hyde Park nights with roar of big Harleys, gunshots and the screams of outraged housewives? Maybe, but not likely. There are other parts of Austin where such establishments naturally gravitate. High rents see to that. If we always apply worst-

case scenario thinking, we wouldn't have any restaurants. For example, what if the owners of Asti's and Hyde Park Bar & Grill decide to cash out and are replaced with Hooter's and Joe's Crab Shack? What then?

Successful densification will likely require, more than ever before, out-of-the-box thinking, flexibility and courage. I invite all the neighbors to participate in this discussion. We can never have too many heads working on this complex, thorny question.

Good neighbors: Thanks to everyone who provided food and help and their presence to make our latest Fire Station Festival an enjoyable and productive afternoon. And thanks to students from the Griffin School who spent an afternoon cleaning up Shipe Park and Waller Creek. They serve as an example for all of us.



the council for adoption on October 6th. All other parts of the NCCD have been adopted by the City Council. She reminded the meeting that there were still properties which had valid permits that were issued before the NCCD was enacted, so there may be a few more nonconforming structures started and built, but that permits issued after August 18th must be in compliance with NCCD zoning.

Bruce Nadig asked the association to consider providing a matching contribution from the legal fund for the neighbors who are in a **legal fight** over development at 609 Fairfield that violates deed restrictions. Bruce said the neighbors have pledged more than \$600 and asked the association to contribute \$600 in matching funds to contest the suit, to be used if and after the neighbors' funds are exhausted. There was considerable discussion of whether HPNA making a contribution to one party in a lawsuit would make it a party to the suit. The motion to provide the matching funds passed.

John Kerr brought up a proposed amendment to the city's **front yard parking** ordinance, authored by another neighborhood association, which will be going before City Council. After discussion, the association voted to oppose a change of language to allow any parking on grass in the yard.

The remainder of the meeting was devoted to a heated and confused discussion of the zoning change to CS-1 and associated parking variance for the proposed wine bar at 4117 Guadalupe. Property owner Thad Avery fielded a mixture of questions and objections. The general question of changing zoning and use was mixed with debates over adequacy of parking and sidewalks in the immediate area, and the desirability (or lack thereof) of the wine bar as a member of the neighborhood business community. Several proposals to reconsider the decisions taken at the September meeting were floated, but the meeting adjourned without taking further action. Action to reconsider may be taken at the November meeting, as the variance application is supposed to come before City Council on November 14th. Some in attendance asked that voting on proposals affecting zoning and use issues should be announced a month ahead of time in the Pecan Press to allow maximum participation by neighbors. John Kerr said this was the procedure the Development Review Committee had been following and would continue to follow for future zoning and use change requests.

The meeting adjourned at 9:20 PM.

and give thanks


And wonder what greed what evil appetite drives man to destroy what God has made has entrusted to his care




